


## WHAT IS THE REQUIREMENT OF THE QUESTION

LOWEST DEGREE OF QUESTION 			HIGHEST DEGREE OF QUESTION		
These type of Questions demand <b>ONLY WHAT</b> part and <b>NO WHY &amp; HOW</b> . These are totally factual and no analysis is required.	In this type of question, <b>EMPHASIS IS ON WHAT</b> part and <b>only LITTLE BIT OF WHY AND HOW</b> is also required. It means that you explicitly write the factual part while just touching the analysis part	Here you need to write a <b>LITTLE BIT OF WHAT &amp; EMPAHSIS IS ON WHY AND HOW</b> . It means that these questions don't require much of factual information, but demand analysis	Here the <b>EMPHASIS IS ON WHY AND HOW. LITTLE CRITIQUE (WHY NOT AND HOW NOT ALSO REQUIRED)</b> It means that no direct mention of factual information; but only analysis. Also the opposite of the statement in a critical manner is also the need, though to a little extent.	This is a high degree of question. Here <b>YOU ARE A JUDGE. BOTH EXPLANATION (WHY &amp; HOW) AND ITS CRITIQUE (WHY NOT AND HOW NOT EQUALLY EMPHASIZED)</b> . It means that you have to dig deeper while answering such questions. Factual information not required, but analysis of that – pro and critical – is desirable. <b>Your OPINION IS ALSO REQUIRED.</b>	Highest degree of a question, needs highest level of creativity. It's an opportunity. Examiner himself doesn't know the answer, you have to create the things based on your knowledge and how well can you analyze.
